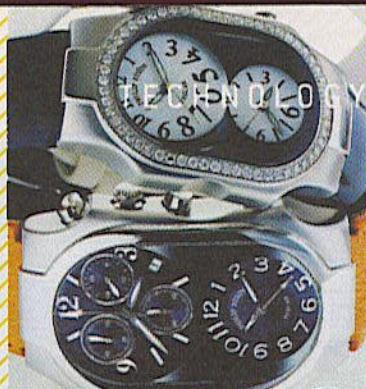
THE ART OF DESTRUCTION

> If you're looking for something to hang on your walls that really makes a statement, something that will make your friends goggle, there's only one place to go: The Aquarium in Woburn Walk, London WC1, a gallery which describes itself as "Purveyors of the finest and roughest in art".

Here you can get everything from rubber-stamp prints on handmade paper by Billy Childish, from just £5, to ex-KLF artist James Cauty's notorious BSO Stamps of Mass Destruction print sequence, for £75. There's also limited edition work by Jamie Reid - best known for his graphics for the Sex Pistols - including his Dirty Linen line of bedding (yes, really!) and outrageous organic cotton T-shirts with cartoon designs by

Sexton Ming and Frank Kozik, for just £20. The gallery will be showing new works by Childish in September, followed by Reid in October.

MAGIC WATCH

> Invented in 1986 by Ilonka Harezi, following a study of healing practices around the world, the Tesla technology inside the Philip Stein Tesla watch is designed to help the body reinforce its own electromagnetic field against the potentially negative effect of external, low-energy electromagnetic fields. Fans of the watch say they experienced deeper sleep, increased energy and a reduction in stress and tension while wearing it.

The body is energised as the watch ticks, via two Tesla chips that interact with the magnetic and electric fields created by the watch's mechanism, producing a waveform that mimics the Earth's natural electronic frequency. Pseudoscientific gobbledegook, or a way of feeling better just by wearing a watch? Who cares when it looks this good with its distinctive double face, clean lines and bold dials?
